Registration

Before Wednesday, Oct. 14, the registration fee is \$40 per weapon fenced. Late registration is \$60 per weapon, cash at the door.

Those without a current CFF license and a competitive membership with the OFA will not be allowed to fence.

There are two ways to register.

A. Fencers who are registered students at one of the Ontario universities that is a member of the OUA fencing league (Brock, Carleton, McMaster, Queen's, RMC, Ryerson, Toronto, Trent, Western), should arrange registration through their head coach.

B. All other fencers (e.g., members of private clubs) register here on-line: <https://event-manager.compete-at.com/ofa/Queens2009>

Note that on-line registration is available only to fencers not affiliated with OUA teams. The on-line registration facility is for members of private clubs and **should not be used by OUA athletes or their coaches.**

General Information

This event is sanctioned by the Ontario Fencing Association and by the Canadian Fencing Federation. The minimum requirements are a valid OFA competitive membership and CFF licence. Those without a current CFF license and a **competitive membership** with the OFA will not be allowed to fence. This tournament will conform to current FIE regulations. The Directoire Technique reserves the right to apply or to modify these regulations as they see fit according to section t.15 of the FIE rules. Sous-plastrons are required. Track pants are acceptable, but fencing pants are strongly recommended. Sabre fencers are required to wear a conductive manchette or glove. Conductive bibs are not required for foil.

Points from this tournament will contribute to the CFF senior domestic rankings.
